A Longest Night service, or Blue Christmas Service, as it is sometimes called, offers an alternative to the joy of the seasonal celebrations for those who find themselves in places of darkness. A Longest Night service is typically held on or around the winter solstice. when daylight is in short supply and darkness lingers. For those who find themselves caught in a long, dark night of the soul, such a service can provide a glimmer of light and hope.

For the first time at First Pres, this year we will offer a Longest Night Service. It will take place in the Chapel on Wednesday, December 20, at 7:00 p.m. During this time of worship and contemplation, you are invited to a quiet refuge of prayer, music and remembrance. We will acknowledge our losses and ponder the everlasting hope that shines as light in the darkness.


You are invited to step into this space of calm, quiet and healing. And you are invited to bring a loved one or friend who might benefit from this experience.




December lessons-Advent, the story of Jesus' birth, and Luke 2:22-40 (Simeon & Anna)

Jim was a long time member of First Pres serving as a Sunday school teacher, a Trustee and an Elder.


Jim always had a kind word and a smile on his face.


